The liturgy of the Church abounds in the celebration of Christ's kingship: the Kyrie, Gloria, Te Deum, the celebration of Epiphany, Palm Sunday and the Ascension. In 1899 Pope Leo XIII dedicated all Christians to the Sacred Heart under the special title of Christ's universal kingship. In 1925 Pope Pius XI established the last Sunday of October as a special feast in honor of this divine reign. This celebration has been transferred to the last Sunday in Ordinary Time to underline the indissoluble relationship between Christ's rule and the perfection of creation in the endtime
