Let us get up then, at long last, for the Scriptures rouse us when they say: it is high time for us to arise from sleep (Romans 13:11). Let us open our eyes to the light that comes from God, and our ears to the voice from heaven that every day calls out this charge: If you hear his voice today, do not harden your hearts (Psalm 94[95]:8). And again: You that have ears to hear, listen to what the Spirit says to the churches (Rev 2:7). And what does he say? Come and listen to me my sons; I will teach you the fear of the Lord (Ps 33[34]:12). Run while you have the light of life, that the darkness of death may not overtake you (John 12:35).

Seeking his workman in a multitude of people, the Lord calls out to him and lifts his voice again. Is there anyone here who yearns for life and desires to see good days? (Ps 33[34]:13. If you hear this and your answer is "I do," God then directs these words to you: If you desire true and eternal life, keep your tongue free from vicious talk and your lips from all deceit; turn away from evil and do good; let peace be our quest and aim (Ps 33[34]:14-15). Once you have done this, my eyes will be upon you and my ears will listen for your prayers; and even before you ask me, I will say to you: Here I am (Isa 58:9). What, dear brothers, is more delightful than this voice of the Lord calling to us? See how the Lord in his love shows us the way of life. Clothed then with faith and performance of good works, let us set out on this way with the Gospel for our guide, that we may deserve to see him who has called us to his kingdom (1 Thess 2:12).

Jesus was traveling with his disciples and many people. A blind man named Bartimaeus was sitting and begging on the side of the road and when he heard that Jesus was in the crowd he began to call to him, saying, "Have pity on me." Although some people told him to be quiet, Bartimaeus kept crying out, and so Jesus stopped and called for him. When Jesus asked what he wanted, Bartimaeus simply said, "Master, I want to see." Jesus said to him, "Go your way, your faith has saved you." And Bartimaeus could see immediately.

Do you ever think about how many blind or sick or injured people were around in Jesus day? But he didn't try to run around trying to heal them all. Instead, he healed those who called out to him for help. What does this mean for us today? What do you think of Bartimaeus already knew about Jesus before he talked to him? What does Jesus mean when he says "your faith has saved you"?
