

2ND SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 8, 2009

ST. ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY CHURCH

"This is my beloved Son"

We can hear in the words an echo of Abraham's words as he offers the Father his only son. In the case of Christ, the Son has come and offered himself, but he has done so out of obedience and the desire to do the Father's will, thus counteracting the disobedience of Adam. For his obedience Christ is rewarded with the transfiguration; the latter becomes then the sign of the transfiguration every man will experience who chooses to walk the paths of God and do the Father's will.

The account of the transfiguration raises a number of problems, but these are not our concern here, since we intend to be faithful to our purpose, which is the liturgical reading of the Scriptures. In Cycle A the transfiguration was seen as resulting from the response to a call. On this second Sunday of Cycle B, the theme is somewhat different: now the transfiguration crowns the response to a call, but a response that includes the offering of sacrifice. This is the theme of the first reading, on the sacrifice of Abraham. It is also the theme of the second reading, in which St. Paul reminds us that God has handed over his own Son for our salvation. It is Christ's willingness to sacrifice himself that gives full meaning to the words, "This is my beloved Son."

2nd Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel reading, Mark tells us that Jesus led Peter, James and John up a high mountain. While there, Jesus was transfigured and appeared with Moses and Elijah. Peter, being nervous and wanting to please Jesus, offered to make three tents — one for each of them. Suddenly, they heard the voice of God proclaiming, "This is my beloved son. Listen to Him." When this was all done and the four were heading back down the mountain, Jesus made them promise not to tell anyone what had happened until he had risen from the dead.

What do you think the word "transfigured" means? If you were one of the disciples and saw this, what would your reaction be? Do you think it was easy for the disciples to keep this secret? Why or why not? Can you keep a secret when asked to?
