The Place of Priests and Bishops Who Are Passing Through

But if a priest from another community comes, you, the priests, are to welcome him to your place.

And if he is a bishop, he is to sit with the bishop, who is to judge him as worthy as himself and make him share the honor of his place.

And you, O bishop, are to ask him if he will be kind enough to speak to your people, for the exhortations and advice of strangers are very useful.

The Place of the Poor

If a poor man or a poor woman comes, whether they are from your own parish or another, especially if they are advanced in years, and there should be no room for them, then make a place for them, O bishop, with all your heart, even if you yourself have to sit on the ground. You must not make any distinction between persons, if you wish your ministry to be pleasing to God.
