WILLIAM BYRD FESTIVAL - Three weekends of music by the most famous composer of the English Renaissance, William Byrd (1540-1623) are set for August 10--26 in three Portland locations: St. Stephen Church 1112 SE 41st Avenue, Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, 147 NW 19th, and Holy Rosary Church, 37 NE Clackamas. This year's festival, the 16th, features concerts August 10 and 26 performed by the Portland liturgical choir Cantores in Ecclesia with Richard Marlow of Trinity College, Cambridge, and organist Mark Williams of Jesus College, Cambridge. The festival includes four Latin masses, Compline and Evensong services, an organ recital, and three lectures on Byrd's music by scholars. Tickets for the two concerts --\$20 or \$15 for students and seniors -- are available at the door or in advance through www.brownpaper-tickets.com, or 1-800-838-3006. All other events include a free-will offering.

Gospel Reflection

"I am the bread from heaven!" This solemn saying provokes scandalized murmurs from the crowd.

A tragic misunderstanding has arisen between Jesus and his hearers. Before identifying himself as the bread of life, Jesus shared the bread of ordinary people. For thirty years his life was marked by everyday meals, festival meals, funeral meals. At the end of those years, the crowd sees only the man who has shared their bread. "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? How can he claim to have come down from heaven?" The heart of unbelief is to see in Jesus only the one who shares the bread of people, not the one who shares his own life in the bread. "The bread I will give you is my flesh, for the life of the world.

Jesus is the one who gives the bread. We are tempted to reduce religion to the initiative of the one who decides for God. But it is God who first shares life with us.
