<u>ALL GRADE SCHOOL CHILDREN</u> who are participating in the music at the 4:00 PM Family Mass on Christmas Eve will meet at the "Little House" at 10:00 AM on Sunday, December 16 and Sunday, December 23 for practice.

Today's gospel deals with the Baptist, that herald of an extraordinary event. The evangelist eports John's cry raised in the desert. He describes his mission to us: to prepare the way, to make traight the road. After a long silence during which there have been no more signs or prophets, God peaks anew. The echo of his voice rumbles across the solitudes announcing a decisive turning point in he history of the world. In an ultimate intervention which fulfills and overflows the ancient hopes, God vill come.

But how? Will he show his presence like a meteor leaving a fiery trail across the lower regions f the atmosphere before pursuing its course through the starry night? Will we only catch a glimpse, in he space of a flash of lightning, and then fall once again into the darkness which covers the world? No, or this Word which erupts into time changes all human history: "All flesh shall see the salvation of God." but to see him we must first die to ourselves in conversion. That is John's message.

It is in the midst of the discordant voices of history that God makes himself heard. By its life of stice, the community of believers ceaselessly sounds forth the invitation to humanity's new exodus.
