"This is the King of the Jews." In Luke this is a simple inscription, in Mark and Matthew a cause or condemnation, in John an affirmation disputed by the chief priests. What a contrast there is between the inscription and the spectacle of the helpless crucified, between the salvation which some expected from him and the reality of this condemned man incapable of saving himself!

For Luke, Jesus on the cross, enduring mockeries and insults, is the type of the persecuted just ne, martyred by the impious who hurl their defiance at him: "If you are the king of the Jews, save ourself." Highlighting the reactions of the two criminals who surround Jesus, Luke shows two possible ttitudes toward the Messiah. One man condemns himself by blaspheming this laughable king, the ther turns to him through whom "we have redemption, the forgiveness of our sins" (Col 1:14). Jesus who, since his temptation in the desert, has refused any demonstration of power for his own advantage, laims that he can save the one who trusts in him, "this day you will be with me in paradise." "This day" is the time of the kingdom already present in the person of Jesus. Here, at the foot of the cross, the bordship of Christ takes root.
