As the economy fluctuates, preoccupation with money remains constant. The most difficult circumstances breed shrewd speculators who know how to play the market. The manager in today's gospel, accused of dissipating his master's goods, rewrites all of the accounts. Jesus admires not his lack of scruples but his ingenuity. Before he is fired, he takes advantage of the short time left to him to make friends. They will remember him when he is put out the door. What an opportunist has done in the affairs of this world, we must also do in the conquest of the kingdom of God.

Jesus shows us a sound investment. He describes Christian cleverness in the domain of seductive wealth. Its formidable powers of attraction may draw us into offering it a worship which ought to be given only to God. We must restore money to its role as a means and not an end. We are only stewards of our master's property. We can hold no exclusive title to what belongs to all his people. We must use it in the service of his kingdom.
