This Sunday's gospel opens with the preaching of Jesus. The time of prophecy had ended with the arrest of the Baptist. He had to decrease so the other could increase. The gates of the prison have been closed upon this voice. Up to this time Jesus has been silent. Henceforth he must proclaim that the kingdom is here.

This proclamation begins surprisingly at this frontier crossroads of Galilee. Common opinion held that nothing good could come from Galilee. (John 1:46) It was to this people, then under subjection, that Isaiah had announced the messianic light of the Immanuel. It is again to them that Jesus addresses himself. He is the one who brings glad tidings, announcing peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation, and saying to Zion, "Your God is King." (Isaiah 52:7). This dawn of the kingdom calls for a change of heart.

From this moment on, the Messiah had some faithful followers. The memory of their fidelity to Jesus remains. Here the Church is born.

In the Gospel according to Matthew, we see again and again how wide is the embrace of Jesus, who comes not only to the chosen people, but to all people. A few days after his birth, Jesus is adored by the wise men, magi from distant lands. And now, early in his ministry, Jesus leaves his hometown and goes to Capernaum. In so doing, he fulfills the words of the prophet Isaiah, who foresaw that God's light would shine not only upon Israel, but upon the Gentiles as well.
