WHO ARE THE PAULISTS?

How are they "different" from the Franciscans, the Jesuits, or Diocesan priests? Fr. Charlie Brunick, CSP will present Part 3 of a 3-part series this Sunday, October 26 to explain why the Paulist Priests are unique in their mission and goals. The presentation will be held at St. Philip Neri Church, SE 16th and Division Street, from 10:45 to 11:45 am following the 9:30 am Mass.



"Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy" (Leviticus 19:2). The people of God must take God as their model. He is loving and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in mercy. In his fidelity, he cares for those who cannot help themselves. The widow, the alien, the orphan are under his special protection (Exodus 22:22; Deuteronomy 14:29).

The people bound to him by covenant must also show their fidelity by caring for the powerless. All the detailed laws of the covenant lead back to this basic principle: the sole demand of God is love.

Jesus says that the second commandment is like the first. In fact it is the manifestation of the first. If you love the Lord your God with your whole being, that love will show itself in the feeding of the hungry, the sheltering of the homeless, the release of the oppressed. Jesus, the supreme revelation of the Father's love (John 3:16), showed the depth of that love by giving his life for us when we were still powerless (Romans 5:6). The sign that we are his disciples is our love for one another (John 13:35).

Soul Cakes

Since we are part of the Communion of Saints, we pray not only for those still living, but also for those who have died. Did you know that Trick or Treating used to be connected with praying for the dead? Centuries ago, beggars would go "souling." The beggar would go from house to house, and the people who lived in the house would give the beggar a "soul cake" (a little like a scone or a muffin) if the beggar would promise to say a special prayer for those of their household or family who had died. Sometimes the beggars would sing a chant such as this:

A soul cake, a soul cake, pray, good missus, a soul cake, An apple, a pear, a plum, a cherry, Any good thing to make us all merry, One for Peter, two for Paul, Three for Him who made us all, Up with the kettle and down with the pan, Give us good alms and we'll be gone.
