The Sundays of Lent in this cycle rehearse the history of God's covenant-making with his people. On this first Sunday we hear of the covenant of God with Noah, the new creation begun after the great destruction of the flood. God will not be defeated by human weakness and failure. Although his children fall, he returns to establish his bond with them.

Jesus comes from the waters of the Jordan to seal once and for all in his blood the covenant of God with this people. In order to build the bridge between humanity and God, he became like us in all things except sin, tempted in every as we are (Hebrews 4:15). Thus made one with us, he leads us back through the waters of death to new creation in his life. We then are witnesses to the new covenant, "the plan God was pleased to decree in Christ, to bring all things in the heavens and on earth into one under Christ's headship" (Ephesians 1:10).

Reflection

Three inseparable events in the life of Jesus, revealed in part by today's Gospel, are his baptism in the River Jordan, his prayer and temptation in the desert, and the inauguration of his ministry in Galilee. In God's plan, Jesus's ministry cannot begin without his reception of a divine mandate ("You are my beloved Son") and a time of incorporating this mandate into his life (prayer and temptation). Ministry that is about the other and not about ourselves must be rooted in a heart that knows temptations, that knows the sacrifices that are necessary in service, and that trusts wholeheartedly in the God who fashioned us as his own,. The Lenten disciplines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving give us plenty of opportunity to experience temptation. We must see temptation as part of our call, as part of the preparation that pushes us forward in ministry.
