By his blessing and breaking the multitude is satisfied.



Reflection

It is very interesting that in John's account of the multiplication of the loaves and the fish the source of the supply is a little boy. The one who is seemingly least significant and valuable in that large crowd of five thousand men is the one who provides the core material for Jesus's great miracle. Once again, this is a Gospel of reversal—Jesus chooses the assistance from the powerless to humble the mighty. Do not be surprised if God chooses to use you in a similar manner—out of your weakness, he may want to demonstrate something very powerful indeed.
