

## HOLY THURSDAY: EVENING MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

On Thursday night Lent has ended and the Church, at this Mass of the Lord's Supper, enters into the Easter Triduum. From the very first moment the all-embracing experience of these three days is proclaimed: "We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. For he is our salvation, our life, and our resurrection. Through him we are saved and made free." This is the whole of the great Triduum. On Thursday night, the liturgy draws us toward this through the scriptures, through the mandatum or washing of the feet, which is the direct expression of our service to one another and the world, through the Eucharistic banquet itself.




## GOOD FRIDAY: THE LITURGY OF THE PASSION

In Good Friday's liturgy of the word and veneration of the cross there is great solemnity; a pondering of the "mystery of our faith," the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Fasting and praying during these days, the Catechumens and the baptized assemble on Good Friday in the afternoon or evening for a time of prayer together. This begins a time of silence.


Because the Good Friday service is a continuation of the Holy Thursday liturgy, there is no entrance rite. The service begins with the presider prostrating himself in a profound gesture of prayer. *The assembly kneels.*

As at Sunday liturgy, the word service concludes with prayers of intercession. Today these prayers take a more solemn form as the church lifts up to God its own needs and those of the world.





## THE VENERATION OF THE CROSS

---

An ancient liturgical text reads: "See here the true and most revered tree. Hasten to Kiss it and cry out with faith: You are our help, most revered Cross." For many centuries the church has solemnly venerated the relic or image of the Cross on Good Friday. It is not present as a picture of suffering only but as a symbol of Christ's Passover, where "dying he destroyed our death and rising restored our life." It is the glorious, the life-giving Cross that the faithful venerate with song, prayer, kneeling, and a kiss. When the Cross is brought into the Church, our sung response is:



All are invited to come and venerate the wood of the Cross according to personal custom. Please come forward as you would during a communion procession.

## THE LITURGY OF HOLY COMMUNION \_\_\_\_\_



This liturgy concludes with a simple communion rite. All recite the Lord's Prayer and receive Holy Communion. There is no concluding rite or dismissal for the church continues to be at prayer throughout the Triduum.




# EASTER VIGIL

The long Lenten preparation, the Lenten disciplines and fast of the faithful, the vigilling and fasting and prayer that have gone on since Thursday night -- all culminate in the great liturgy of this evening. On this night, the church assembles to spend much time listening to scriptures, praying psalms, acclaiming the death and resurrection of the Lord. All of the faithful are called forward, challenged to renounce evil and re-affirm their faith in God. The water of the baptismal font is blessed and the solemn Easter liturgy is celebrated with great joy.

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

---

At the Vigil, the liturgy of the word is an extended time of reading, silence and the chanting of psalms. On this night, when the faithful know the death and resurrection of the Lord in baptism and Eucharist, the church needs first to hear these scriptures which are the foundation of our life together: the creation story, the dividing of the sea, the poetry of Isaiah and Ezekiel, the proclamation of Paul to the Romans and the gospel account of Jesus' resurrection.
