The few verses which end Jesus' discourse on the Good Shepherd sum up the Christian experience of communion with the Lord. Jesus presents himself as the gate of the sheep and their shepherd, but his adversaries have no use for allegory. They challenge him: "If you are the messiah, tell us so in plain words!" (John 10:24). In answer, Jesus describes the attitude the sheep must adopt toward him, the attitude of believers toward the one sent by God.

The source of the communion between Christ and Christians is the union of the Father and the Son: "The Father and I are one." Christ himself is our way to this union: "My sheep hear my voice and they follow me." The Father has entrusted his sheep to Jesus, and Jesus leads them to eternal life. The gate is his cross. He is both the shepherd and the lamb who is sacrificed. He has redeemed us with his life. Therefore, his life is ours: we live in him.
