To enter his reign, we must be humble. Gospel humility is not a religious sadomasochism by self-hatred or obsequiousness. Assertiveness and humility are not mutually exclusive. They both require that we be true to our dignity as images of God. Jesus, who was in the form of God left the first place to take the last. That is why "God exalted him" (Phil. 2:6-9).
